



WALT — THE MAN

WALTER MASTERS, JR. IS GONE.

All the eulogies in his wake can never adequately express the impact his friendship has left on those who were fortunate enough to know him.

Life dealt him a whammy.

He was a spastic paralytic—the result of an injury to his spinal during birth.

He never had much of a chance. But what little that fate bestowed upon him, he cultivated and nourished into a memorable span of 52 years—until he was killed by cancer, last week.

For more than a quarter of a century, he owned and operated Master's Boat Works, at Walloon Lake. For the past 15 years, he was completely paralyzed and a coterie of helpers serviced Walt wherever he went.

He had to be fed. He had to be clothed. He was so totally paralyzed that his every movement had to be supervised by the entourage of helpers who waited on him day and night.

All that Walt had left, from the progressive effects of his birth injury was his fine, resonant voice, his hearing, his appetite, and above all a great brain of genius proportions. His last years on this earth were an increasing burden—but he never complained-to anyone, about anyone.

At the end, cancer had even robbed him of his voice. He could only whisper.

Walt has a real appreciation of the foibles of humanity.

As a senior at Petoskey High School in 1938, Principal Frank Jacobs suggested to him that, in view of his handicap, it would be possible for him to obtain a scholarship at Central Michigan College. Walt had excellent grades.

"I'll think about that," Walt told the principal.

A few days later he was back at Jacob's office.

"I don't think I'll accept that scholarship," he said. "It's because I don't feel that I'm handicapped. I think that my paralysis is actually an asset. I'm not handicapped, I'm privileged.

"I have the privilege of having a challenge that other people do not have."

Thus Walt turned down a free ride to college. Due to the difficulties of moving around, his education was understandably spasmodic.

Recalling Walt's high school days, classmate, Bob Donaldson said:

"We used to carry his books, and some of the boys would help him walk up and down the corridors. He could still walk a little then. And he rode a bicycle and he later drove his own car. But we all knew that his affliction would become steadily worse.

"Sometimes he'd take a bad spill from his bike. He'd never swear or cry. The most that he'd concede to pain was a groan and a facial grimace."

During World War II, Walt got a job as an inspector at the Ford Motor Company-a job that he could have had for the rest of his life. But he had the business to take care of back in Walloon--and his mother to look after, too. His father had died of cancer.

While in Detroit he made the acquaintance of several Mexicans and he learned to love their temperament, their foods, and their language. In addition to taking night courses at Wayne, he studied Spanish on the side.

Someday he planned to visit Mexico—and he made it—after the war. Through a business acquaintance, he made contact with the Nunez family, and from that first Mexican vacation, there came a string of young Mexican and Cuban boys--who came to live with Walt, aid in caring for him, and assisting his faithful male nurse "Red" Lenitch in his chores. Walt aided them financially in attending college in Petoskey.

There was Carlos, and Rennie, and Peppi, and Benjamin, and Raoul, and on and on-perhaps eleven young men were all part of Walt's

stable of aides. He talked to them in Spanish--for they dearly loved the musical lilt of that language.

Walter's widowed sister Mrs. Mildred "Dude" Breidenstein came to supervise Walt's household as well as aid Walt's mother in her last years.

Her vivacious personality did much to help Walt in his last weeks here.

Always an imaginative practitioner of the practical joke and the rib. Two years ago Walt had a great deal of fun with Rev. Richard Deters, SJ, Cincinnati, Ohio, a prodigious angler who regularly fished Walloon. When Rev. Deter's car accidentally was pulled into the water during a launching operation, Walt ribbed him endlessly about the terrible language he must have used as his car sank below the waves—even though Walt wasn't present when the incident occurred. My wife and I had made a practice of seeing Walt about every week, when it was discovered that he had cancer--shortly after the holidays. Just a week ago, we saw him for the last time—alive.

We knew the pain must have been excruciating. Every few minutes someone had to shift his wheel chair, and hand him more pain pills. He could only whisper.

And as we left him for that last time, he whispered:

"Thanks again for coming. And when you see Deters, tell him that I'm leaving ahead of him because I got to fix it up with St. Peter for him. He's going to have a hard time getting in for that awful language he used when his boat sank."

There was a smile on his face, even though it was crooked from the vast pain. That was Walt. Always putting in a good word for someone—regardless of who they were—or what they were. Walt, the man who never had a complaint against life--in spite of the raw deal he had.

The famous "Gator Den" that Walt used to visit with family and friends on the weekend to look for the "Buckerlus". The buckerlus is a combination of a buck (head), walrus (body), and peacock (tail). It was created by a lighting bolt, and was used to keep guard over the Master's Boat Works so the children and teenagers would not





